Thank You Nuell for Your Years of Service to CLH

Extraordinary volunteer remembered fondly at Walnut Village

T Te was known as a virtual fixture at Walnut ■ Village every Tuesday afternoon for decades as a volunteer. He served faithfully on the California Lutheran Homes Board of Directors and he brought smiles and laughter to those who knew him. Nuell Lunde, who died in the summer after years of service to California Lutheran Homes and Community Services (CLH) is remembered as a friend, dedicated volunteer and a man of integrity and deep spiritual convictions.

"He pushed his store cart around the Care Center and spent hours talking to residents, making them laugh,

listening to their concerns and telling stories of his own," said David Dixon, resident services director at Walnut Village. "He was here every Tuesday. He never missed a day and the residents and his fellow volunteers loved him."

Nuell, a former State of California employee and U.S. Army veteran, served as the Bishop's

Representative on the CLH Board in the early 1980s and continued to serve on the Board through the 1990s.

"Nuell Lunde was the epitome of self-giving and good judgment with a consistent focus on the other," said CLH President and CEO Gary Wheeler. "His Board service and decision making were like few others. The greatest compliment you can offer another is to say I wish I were more like him or her. I wish I were more like Nuell Lunde."

Following his service on the CLH Board, Nuell began his long career as a volunteer saying he was "answering a calling" to do so. His affinity for Walnut Manor created a natural fit for the Yorba

Linda resident

"At the time his passion was physical fitness," remembers CLH Auxiliary Director Bonnie Stover. "He loved volunteering at the Walnut Manor (later Walnut Village) Fitness Center showing residents how to work the equipment properly and safely. But what he was actually doing was making new friends every day. He was a soft-spoken man and an interesting one. He always knew the right things to say to get a conversation started. A lot of residents visited the gym just to talk to Nuell. That's the kind

Bonnie said she soon realized that Nuell had a gift and encouraged him to do more at the newly opened Walnut Village and Walnut Village Rehabilitation and Care Center. She asked him to visit residents in the Care Center and he obliged.

"I feel people do best doing

what they love," said Larry Liles a fellow CLH volunteer and past CLH Board chair. "Nuell showed that love every minute he volunteered at Walnut Village."

Developing relationships. That's what volunteering at Walnut Manor meant to Nuell Lunde, he said himself during a 2005 interview with CLH Today ... "I enjoy meeting the residents. The best part of volunteering is developing some close relationships. I've made a great many friends and I hope they count me as one of theirs."

ongregations have lifespans and, at times, are enhancement of affordable housing and supportive best served by transforming a ministry into something of a greater service to fulfill a community need. In the past several years, a variety of collaborative models have evolved to help Lutheran Church congregations express their mission in new and exciting ways.


One such congregation, Grace Lutheran Church in Santa Barbara, Calif. closed its doors permanently in 2014. However, as one door closes, another opens as

it found a new opportunity to continue its mission of community service. After experiencing dwindling membership and conducting much soul searching, the congregation decided to donate its church building and land to California Lutheran Homes and Community Services (CLH) for the purpose of transforming the property into an affordable senior housing community, satisfying a tremendous need in Santa Barbara. In this way, Grace Lutheran leaves a legacy to the community it served for more than 40 years and will continue to impact it in the future.

Another example is St. John's Manor in Glendale, Arizona. St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church acquired additional land in the hopes of building a larger sanctuary. However, this viable congregation decided instead, to use the excess property for the expansion of its mission into the community at-large by sponsoring an affordable housing community. As a result of their efforts, St. John's Manor is a 43-unit senior affordable housing community adjacent to St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church. St. John's Manor is vibrant with a great deal of interaction between its residents and the church community.

California Lutheran Homes and Community Services has a long history of turning donors' gifts into lasting legacies. It is dedicated to the development and

social ministry and is uniquely positioned to help churches who wish to leave a service legacy. CLH is an affiliated social ministry organization of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) with board members from constituent congregations of the ELCA and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS). CLH partners with CARING Housing Ministries, a not-for-profit affordable housing management company that is part of Front Porch.
